



Impact of Pupil Premium Expenditure 2015-2016

Achievement and Attainment for End of Summer Term 2016

General trend

By the end of Year 2, the Pupil Premium Funded children have made the same or better progress than other pupils in their class.

Foundation Stage

13 children (18.5%) were eligible for PPG in this year group.

38% of these children achieved a Good Level of Development (0 children in receipt of PPG were at Age Related Expectations on entry to school).

Where attainment is lower, pupils receive extra support to ensure they make accelerated progress to close the gap with their peers.

Year 1

18 children (26%) were eligible for PPG in Year 1.

Children eligible for the PPG attain less highly than others in the cohort. They make accelerated progress or progress in line with their peers.

| SPAG | 75% | 75% |
| Writing | 78% | 90% |
| Maths | 83% | 83% |

Where attainment is lower and progress is slower, pupils receive extra support to make accelerated progress in order to reach age related expectations.

Year 2

9 pupils (21%) were eligible for PPG in Year 2

Children in receipt of PPG attain less highly than other pupils in the cohort.

| Reading | 89% | 88% |
| Writing | 89% | 81% |
| Maths | 89% | 88% |
