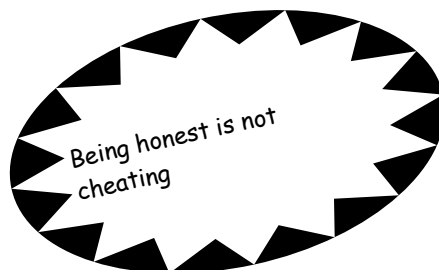
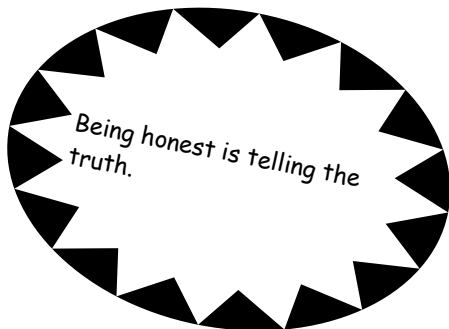
Honesty for the children
